President's Report

I was pondering what I should write about. Every idea I came up with that had anything to do with the business of the Chamber, had me circling back to the state of our economy. I have to admit that I was a bit hesitant to wade into such a high risk topic, but then decided what the heck. I cannot claim any particular expertise on the subject, but then again it seems not many others can either.

There is general agreement that the global economy is about to experience significant structural change. This is not hard to imagine given the wrenching change that is occurring in the US and China, two of the world's dominant economies. We have had economic and social change before, but I agree, something is definitely different this time. The tsunami that hit the global economy is not only impacting everyone, it is happening at breakneck speed. I think, as do most economists, that the economy will recover as it has following previous upheavals. But it is hard to imagine that it will ever be the same, in other words business as usual.



Some of the world's major financial and banking institutions are on life support and as remarkable as it seems, their sickness appears to have been self-induced. For sure, they will never again be allowed to operate unfettered. With major government bailouts in the offing, the long regulatory fingers of government will be scratching their way into the very foundations of the international banking systems. Some argue that this is completely justifiable given the huge taxpayer-supported parachutes being strapped onto banks and financial institutions to prevent them from crashing to the ground.

We are even hearing that nationalization of some major banks and financial institutions is a possible outcome. If nationalization of the banks turns out to be the medicine, is it possible that it might end up being worse than the disease?

So how will all this impact Saskatchewan and Saskatoon? First, I think that our province and city are in a very enviable situation. But let's be clear, our economy although remarkably resilient is not isolated from all of this. With our largest trading partner suffering through some pretty tough economic times we will inevitably experience some pain. But for sure there is no other jurisdiction in the industrialized world that has the positive outlook that we have. We are still projecting positive growth through 2009 in Saskatchewan and our city will be the epicentre of that growth.

So what is our comparative advantage? Why is our economy so resilient in the face of this enormous economic turmoil? It certainly doesn't hurt that we are world leaders in two relatively recession-proof businesses—energy and food. The growing global population still needs to eat and still needs access to energy to power their economies and ensure their personal well-being.

But there is clearly much more to it than that. Our recipe for success in my opinion lies in the diversity of our economy. Our natural resource endowments in agriculture, mining, oil and gas and forestry are the first ingredients in this recipe. To this, we add a mix of manufacturing, tourism, wholesale/retail and the public sector. And we serve it up with world-renowned capability in research and innovation, a skilled and available labour force, and a strong, ethical business culture. The final ingredient that adds to the robustness of our economic recipe is leadership, not only in business but also in government. We have the benefit of pro-business, visionary leadership in both the city and provincial governments.

Our mission at the Greater Saskatoon Chamber of Commerce is to "build the best business climate in Canada, thereby creating a city of opportunity." I think it is rather remarkable, given the economic challenges we face, that we actually have a realistic chance of delivering on this.

Exceed the North American average membership retention rate of 86%.

Generate a profit from the newsletter by end of plan period.

Result: Over \$7,985 with a healthy retained surplus of \$254,317.

- Prepare and stage a Sype/Youth mixer and Strategic Plan presentation by end of year 2009.

- Continue to press the "Productivity in Government" agenda and succeed in getting at least one more institution formally adopting a productivity agenda before end of plan period.
 - SaskEnergy had an excellent report in 2009.
 - Third Annual City of Saskatoon report received. Fourth report is expected in April 2010.
 - Several lean initiatives are underway at the Saskatoon Health Region.
 - The Saskatchewan Rate Review Panel now requires a productivity report with each rate increase request from SaskPower, SaskEnergy, or SGI.





Protection of Officers and Others Limitation of Liability Every director and officer of the Chamber in exercising his or her powers and discharging his or her duties shall act honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the chamber and exercise the care, diligence and skill that a reasonably prudent person would exercise in comparable circumstances. Subject to the foregoing, no director or officer shall be liable for the acts, receipts, neglects or defaults of any other director or officer or employee, or for any loss, damage or expense happening to the Chamber through the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency or tortuous acts of any person with whom any of the moneys, securities or effects of the Chamber shall be deposited, or for any loss occasioned by any error

of judgement or oversight on his or her part, or for any other loss, damage or misfortune whatever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his or her office or in relation thereto; provided that nothing herein shall relieve any director or officer from the duty to act in accordance with the Act and the regulations thereunder or from liability for any breach thereof.

- 2.) Indemnity The Chamber shall indemnify a director or officer, a former director or officer, or a person acts or acted at the Chamber's request as a director or officer of a body corporate of which the Chamber is or was a shareholder or creditor, and his or her heirs and legal representatives, against all costs, charges and expenses, including an amount paid to settle an action or satisfy a judgement, reasonably incurred by him or her in respect of any civil, criminal or administrative action or proceeding to which he or she is made a party by reason of being or having been a director or officer of the Chamber, if:
 - I. He or she acted honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of the corporation; and
 - II. In the case of a criminal or administrative action or proceeding that is enforced by a monetary penalty, he or she had reasonable grounds for believing that his or her conduct was lawful.

The Chamber shall also indemnify such person in such other circumstances as the Act permits or requires.
